

Course & Other Fees (One Academic Year)

International students, except exchange students, are charged tuition based on the number of courses they enrol in each year. Tuition fees must be paid in advance of each semester/teaching period. The precise date for the initial payment and the amount to be paid will be stated in the offer letter.

Tuition and fees for international students vary depending on your area of study. These UCC cost estimates are based on full-time enrolment for <u>year one only</u> for the fall and spring semesters (i.e. this is <u>an 8-month</u> <u>budget</u>) unless otherwise indicated. Tuition fees are subject to change and an increase/review each academic year.

Students are encouraged to also budget for other living expenses such as meals, books and supplies. Meals are estimated at US\$80 per week and

transportation at US\$40 per week. Please add a 15% to estimated costs for incidental charges. All costs are quoted in US Dollars and are subject to change.

Affidavit of Support

International students must furnish proof that they have available funds to cover the first year of their study and available funds for each subsequent year.

Financial documentation must reflect proof to cover tuition, accommodation and miscellaneous living expenses. The available amount on the completed **Financial Affidavit/Statement Form** should be reflected in US Dollars and should be translated in English. Certified bank statements must accompany the financial forms as well as letters outlining financial responsibilities from any sponsor *including* parents if parents are sponsors. A <u>notarized photograph of the sponsor</u> (parent or non-parent) must accompany all financial documentation. Documents must be notarized by Notary Public residing in the country in which the applicant resides.

The Financial Statement Form should be sent via courier or scanned and sent by email to the International Office/Admissions Office (international@ucc.edu.jm). Applicants are advised to retain copies of any financial documentation if necessary for obtaining student visa.

Entry Requirements

English Language requirements

English is the language of instruction and assessment at UCC. Therefore, the student's success is likely to be better if he is proficient in English. All applicants whether domestic or international, for admission to any UCC program delivered either in Jamaica or online, must provide evidence that their English language ability meets the minimum requirements for admission.

You will be deemed to have satisfied the English language requirements if you can provide evidence that you meet one or more of the following criteria:

- Standardized English Language Tests & UCC English Preparation Courses
- Prior study in the medium of English

UCC recognizes a number of English Language tests. Please see the table below. The test or English course must have been undertaken no more than **two years** prior to the commencement of the program at UCC.

Prior Study

Senior Secondary Studies

If you have successfully completed an assessable Senior Secondary qualification from an English-speaking country¹ you do not have to prove proficiency in English provided the <u>qualification</u> was:

- a. taught and examined in English
- b. completed no more than **two years** prior to the commencement of the program at UCC

Post Secondary or Tertiary Studies

If you have successfully completed at least **two** years of full-time study in an assessable qualification at a recognised university or other post-secondary institution where the <u>sole language of instruction</u> and <u>assessment</u> was English, you may not be required to undertake a standardized language test if you can provide a statement or certificate issued by the Registrar (or equivalent) of that institution confirming this.

- The statement or certificate must be on official headed paper, and must be the original document.
- The study must have been completed no more than **two years** prior to the commencement of the UCC program.

Alternatively, if your studies were undertaken more than two years prior to the commencement of the program at UCC you may meet UCC's English Language Proficiency requirements provided

- you have satisfactorily completed a degree or other assessable post-secondary qualification of a minimum duration of three full-time years (or equivalent) at an institution where the sole language of instruction and assessment was English, and
- you have resided in a predominately English-speaking country¹ since graduation. You will need to provide proof of residency with your application for admission.

Candidates will *usually* be considered to meet the English language requirements on the basis that:

- Their first language/mother tongue is English **or** they provide satisfactory evidence showing that they have:
 - Substantial (minimum of 24 months) education (secondary or higher) conducted and assessed in English; or
 - Passed acceptable examinations in English equivalent to GCSE/GCE O Level English Language grade C; or
 - Passed, at an appropriate level, a test of proficiency* in English acceptable to the University; or
 - Achieved advanced level 5 of the UCC ESL course.

A test of proficiency may be required for entry to UCC degree programs.

Entry Requirements for UCC Undergraduate degrees:

All students applying for undergraduate programs must submit the following:

- An application fee (non-refundable) of US\$100 (payable to PayPal using international@ucc.edu.jm)
- Completed UCC Application Form
- Certified copy of High School Diploma or Certificate of Equivalency / Proficiency (with minimum Grade Point Average of 2.5 or 70% must have been obtained in at least five subjects including **Mathematics** and **English**) OR
- Certified copy of GCE O Level passes at A, B or C in five (5) subjects including Mathematics and English or International Baccalaureate (IB) or other international qualification deemed equivalent (subject to UCC approval)
- One recent electronic/digital passport size photo (no older than six months)
- Copy of passport information page
- Certified copy of birth certificate (certified English translation) may be required.
- Completed **Affidavit of Support Form** and bank statement(s) demonstrating that the student can support him/herself during his/her stay in Jamaica
- Official Transcripts of all secondary school (and other universities) coursework and grades (translated in English). "Official" means that the applicant must request that his/her school send transcripts directly to the UCC Registry (registry@ucc.edu.jm OR admissions@ucc.edu.jm). These transcripts must be evaluated by one of the following organizations:

Entry Requirements for UCC Graduate degrees:

The minimum graduate admissions requirements will vary and depend on whether the program is offered by UCC or one of its partner universities. *Generally*, the requirements are

- 1. A bachelor's degree from an accredited university (with a minimum of 2.5 GPA)
- 2. Relevant proficiency test scores (from the completion of the Commonwealth Executive Management Achievement Test)
- 3. Working knowledge of the English Language
- 4. Minimum three years' working experience (for MBA)/5 years' experience for EMBA.

In addition to the above items, international students applying for graduate programs must submit the following:

- Completed Application for Admission
- Non-refundable application fee of US\$100
- Verification of Bachelor's Degree completion
- A two-page written essay detailing education, work history, goals pertaining to the future and how they relate to the Commonwealth / UCC MBA program
- Current Résumé or Curriculum Vitae
- Two letters of recommendation (from managers or colleagues, or from past or present professors or academic advisors)
- Financial Documentation
- Copy of passport information page
- One electronic passport size photo (no older than 6 months)
- Official Transcripts (translated in English) from other universities or institutions that the student has attended (Official Transcript must be sent <u>directly</u> to the University College of the Caribbean from the college or university attended); for degrees received outside of the Caribbean, transcripts must be evaluated by one of the following organizations:

English as a Second Language at UCC

English as a Second Language (ESL) – beginner, intermediate and advanced levels

The English as a Second Language (ESL) program is:

- Level beginner, intermediate and advanced
- Lessons per week: 18
- Duration of lesson: 60 minutes
- Program duration: 3 weeks; 9 weeks; 3 months; 6 months; 1 year
- Period of operation: all year round
- Provides language support for students who want to achieve appropriate levels of proficiency in English for entry into degree programs offered at UCC and a cultural immersion experience in English.
- Each program combines English language training with cultural activities.

Students will take an English placement test upon arrival at UCC and will be placed in the appropriate level of English study. There are five (9-week sessions) levels. Student moves to the next level after successful completion of the previous. Students must satisfactorily complete UCC's advanced level (level 5) English to meet the conditions for entry for English proficiency; proficiency at this level (equivalent to the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages – CEFR – C1) will be equivalent for the purpose of satisfying the entrance requirements for UCC degree programs.

The shorter (3-week – 9 week), more flexible ESL program is ideal for students who wish to learn English to function more effectively at work, home or in their community. The ESL programs include field trips to acquaint students with the Jamaican culture.

Entry Requirements for ESL:

All ESL applicants must submit the following:

- A completed application form
- Certified copy of passport information page
- One electronic passport size photo
- Birth Certificate (certified English translation) may be required
- Non-refundable application fee of US\$100 (reduced to US\$50 for Academic Year 2017-2018)
- Financial documentation demonstrating that the student can support himself during his stay in Jamaica.

Cultural Immersion

Cultural Immersion Program

- 3-credit program offered over two weeks (or alternatively, 1-credit over 1 week with a special emphasis Jamaican Music, Dance, Theatre, Sports or Health & Wellness)
- Explores the Jamaican culture through an intensive on-campus study and field experience. Topics include an overview of the linguistic, historical, geographical, socio-political, economic and artistic expressions of the country.
- The program is designed to add tangible value to the adult learning experience by stimulating awareness, with hands-on insights into the context of other societies and peoples.

Entry Requirement for Cultural Immersion Program:

Applicants submit:

- A completed application form
- Certified copy of passport information page
- One electronic size passport photo
- Birth Certificate (certified English translation)
- Non-refundable application fee of US\$100
- Financial documentation demonstrating that student can support himself during his stay in Jamaica.

School of Medicine, Health & Applied Sciences

UCC has partnered with the Caribbean School of Medical Sciences, Jamaica (CSMSJ) to offer selected medical programs. Poised to become one of the Caribbean's premier institutions for medical education and training, CSMSJ is committed to developing a quality workforce of professionals ready to confront and conquer the challenges of 21st century medicine.

CSMSJ is headed by Dr. Neville Graham, OD, MD, FRCS (Edinburgh), Consultant Surgeon and Dean with Professor Errol Morrison, OJ, MD, PhD as Chairman of the Board of Governors.

Students are enrolled for classes starting in both September (Fall) and January (Spring).

The Programs of Study

1. **Pre-Med or Dental Program** - four (4) semesters (16 months), and ninety (90) credit hours that culminate in a Diploma in Pre-Medical Sciences.

These students will be able to do the Medical College Admission Test (MCAT) and can apply for General Medicine, Dentistry or Veterinary Sciences.

Entry Requirements:

Pre Med or Dental Degree Entry Requirements

Five CSEC subjects at the General Proficiency Level (B+ and above) including:

- 1. Mathematics and English
- 2. Three other subjects which must include a minimum of two related science subjects (e.g. Biology, Physics and Chemistry)
- 3. Equivalent qualifications from other countries, which will be verified by the Program Director.

Award: (i.e., degree, diploma, certificate)

- On successful completion of this Pre Med course of study, the graduates will receive the Diploma in Pre Med.
- On successful completion of this Pre Dental course of study, the graduates will receive the Diploma in Pre Dental.

Programs Include

- Pre-med classes (Full-time/Day) -
 - History, Psychology, Philosophy, English 1 & 2 (/Academic writing 1 & 2)
 - Mathematics, Physics, Chemistry, Biochemistry
 - Students are prepared for Diploma in Pre-Medical or Dental Sciences and the Medical College Admissions Test (MCAT), the standardized multiple -choice exam used by medical schools (in the US) to assess the student's readiness for the study of medicine.
- 2. Doctor of Medicine is a twelve (12) semester (4 yr) study that includes Basic Sciences and Clinical Rotations in Hospitals and Primary Health Care Facilities, in Jamaica, Cuba, the Caribbean, as well as in

the United States.

MD Degree Entry Requirements

1. Caribbean School of Medical Sciences, Jamaica Entrance Examination with a minimum score of 60%. OR: one of the following requirements must be met:

- Pre-Med Qualification with a GPA of 3.2
- First degree in Sciences/Health Sciences(Public Health, Biology, Pharmacology etc) with a GPA of 3.2

Equivalent qualifications from other countries (subject to UCJ regulations)

- 2. Medical Colleges Admissions Test (MCAT), with a minimum score of 24.
- 3. Advanced placement with appropriate qualifications, will be for people who are over 40 years old but less than 50.
 - NB: Students whose mother language is not English and have not passed Secondary level English language will be required to pass an English Proficiency Test.
 - All prospective students with appropriate qualifications will be interviewed after initial assessment.

Medical program includes

- Our MD course is a United States License Examination (USMLE) curriculum and all the students will be prepared for Steps I, II and III USMLE examinations, making them eligible to practise in the USA and other countries that accept USMLE qualification. The curriculum incorporates an integrated, blended organ system approach and clinical experience.
- Basic Life Support for Health Care Providers (8 hours certificate)
- o Spanish
- Sports Medicine
- o Public Health

Award: (i.e., degree, diploma, certificate)

On successful completion of this MD course of study, the graduates will receive the Doctor of Medicine (MD).

LAW (University of London) Programs at UCC

Entry Requirements

Students applying to the University of London CertHE in Common Law:

To satisfy the entrance requirements for the UOL CertHE Common Law, applicants must have either passes in:

- Five subjects at GCE O level or equivalent, including Mathematics and English at GCSE/GCE O level at Grade C or above
- Provide proof of competence in English which is acceptable to the University. A test of proficiency may be required.

Students applying to the University of London Bachelor's of Laws degree:

To satisfy the entrance requirements for the UOL LLB, applicants must have either passes in:

- Two subjects at GCE A level, plus at least three further subjects at GCSE/GCE O level at Grade C or above or
- Three subjects at GCE A level (with one A level at not less than grade D) or
- Three subjects at GCE A level and one further subject at GCSE/GCE O level at Grade C or above or
- Two subjects at GCE 'A' level, plus two further subjects at GCE AS level and
- Provide proof of competence in English which is acceptable to the University. A test of proficiency may be required.

Application Instructions

Students should be 17 years of age at the time of enrolment in a course of study (for undergraduate).

- 3. Application Fee A non-refundable application fee of US\$100 must accompany each application.

Accommodation/Housing

Accommodation/Housing

Once the student registers, the **University of the Commonwealth Caribbean (UCC)** will assist the student to find suitable and affordable living accommodation in Kingston, Jamaica.

The following options are available:

1) Furnished apartment/house (own room, shared facilities) Students may be required to cover additional costs for utilities (water, electricity, internet, cable).







2) Furnished apartment/house (shared room, shared facilities)

Students may be required to cover additional costs for utilities (water, electricity, internet, cable).





3) Furnished off-campus student housing (own room, shared facilities)



4) Homestay (with a family)

Owners <u>may</u> provide breakfast and/or dinner. Host families are assessed for suitability. The Homestay program offers a great opportunity for students to experience the Jamaican culture and practise English by living with families in real life situations.

Student Health Insurance Plan

All international students (undergraduate and graduate) are required to have health insurance coverage. The Student Health Insurance Plan consists of basic benefits hospitality/specialty care coverage with an international provider, Guard.Me International. The cost for coverage under the University's Health Plan is US\$750 per annum. UCC recommends comprehensive travel health insurance.

Health History and Immunization Record

ALL students will be required to submit a medical record including immunization record (see International Student Health Form).

Recommendations that are marked "Vaccination sometimes recommended" should be considered as "Vaccination strongly recommended" if a person is travelling frequently or spending extended time in that country. All travelers are advised to ensure that tetanus and polio vaccinations are kept up to date. Recommendations do change from to time and it is important to discuss your personal requirements with your doctor. (www.netdoctor.co.uk/travel/disease).

Visa Requirements

Before travelling to Jamaica, the student:

• Should also travel with proof of his/her student status (that is, a Student ID card) or if a new student, with the Official Offer Letter from the University.

Foreign nationals who seek to enter Jamaica for full time study must satisfy the following immigration criteria:

NEW STUDENTS

Valid national passport (must be valid for at least 6 months) Entry visa (where applicable) Return ticket valid for one year Letter of acceptance from UCC indicating the program to which acceptance has been granted Evidence of funds for maintenance Address for local accommodation

Please note:

- Commonwealth citizens (except citizens of Cameroon, Maldives, Mozambique, Nigeria, Pakistan, Rwanda, Samoa, Sri Lanka, the British Virgin islands and the Cayman Islands) who wish to study in Jamaica do <u>not</u> require student visas. However, said student will be required to apply for an "Extension of Stay" (see below).
- Students from Commonwealth countries and other countries that would normally not require a visa for entry to Jamaica may still have to obtain a visa prior to entry to be able to travel via international routes to Jamaica. If a visa is required, the student must apply to a Jamaican Embassy, High Commission or Consular representative within his jurisdiction.
- Students from all non-Commonwealth countries <u>must</u> obtain a student visa for study in Jamaica. This must be obtained prior to their arrival.
- Visa applications are usually received at Jamaican Consular Posts overseas and referred locally for decision.

Passport, Immigration & Citizenship Agency's (PICA's) processing time is five (5) working days, however, each mission will add a few days for administrative procedures.

Each applicant is required to complete an application form and submit relevant documents to support the purpose of the application. It must be noted, that even though a visa is a prerequisite for entry, the final decision rests with the immigration officer at the port of entry.

INTERNS

Although these persons may still be considered as students, they are required to obtain work

permits/exemptions through the Ministry of Labour & Social Security prior to their arrival in the Island. Entry visas will also be applicable.

Upon arrival at the airport (Norman Manley International Airport – NMIA), the student:

- Must have the letter of acceptance from UCC on him/her.
- Will have the duration of stay stamped in his/her passport by an immigration officer.

After Arrival

Foreign nationals who are granted entry to study are usually landed for a minimum of thirty (30) days. Prior to the expiration of that time, the student:

- Must visit the UCC International Office to arrange for a date to apply for an "Extension of Stay"/endorsement from the Passport, Immigration & Citizenship Agency (PICA) in Jamaica for the duration of the program. This extension of stay endorses the student as a student and not a visitor/tourist.
- Must complete the (PICA) Extension of Stay form
- Must attend PICA's Extension of Stay Unit located on the 1st Floor, 25 Constant Spring Road, Kingston 10 where an application for extension of stay as a student must be submitted.
- Must pay (PICA) the Endorsement/Extension of Stay fee of J\$10,000.00.
- If a non-Commonwealth national or a national of Nigeria, Pakistan, Sri Lanka, British Virgin Islands and the Cayman Islands seeking an extension of stay, must <u>also</u> pay (PICA) for a multiple entry visa fee as follows:

USA:	J\$2,000.00
Belgium:	J\$1,000.00
Holland:	J\$1,000.00
France:	J\$1,600.00
Mexico:	J\$1,500.00
Venezuela:	J\$1,200.00
Spain:	J\$800.00
Israel:	J\$600.00
Switzerland:	J\$600.00
Others:	J\$500.00

The Extension of Stay Application Form must be accompanied by:

- Valid Passport
- Acceptance /status letter stating course being pursued and the duration/expected date of graduation
- Processing fee J\$10,000
- Re-entry visa fee (ranges from J\$500 J\$2000; depending on nationality)
- Registration fee J\$2,000 (applicable based on age and nationality)

The processing time for Extension of Stay is three (3) working days. The Extension of Stay granted is for

the duration of the program or the validity of the passport whichever comes first. Note, there is an administrative fee of \$50,000 should any of the instances outlined below becomes applicable:

- 1. An applicant has overstayed the time granted at the port prior to seeking an extension of stay.
- 2. Having received an extension, the applicant failed to renew after it has expired and remained in the island without valid immigration status.
- 3. Having gained acceptance to UCC, the applicant entered the Island without the requisite entry visa.

Where to apply for a student visa?

Non-Commonwealth students and students from Commonwealth countries requiring visas must obtain a student visa from the Jamaican Embassy (Consular Section) in their home country or the nearest Consulate Office before coming to Jamaica. The Government of Jamaica may authorize a Mission or Consular post in a Commonwealth country or the British Consulate in a non-Commonwealth country to issue visas on its behalf (please contact the nearest Jamaican mission for information on this). The list of diplomatic missions overseas can be found at http://embassy.goabroad.com/embassies-of/jamaica or www.embassypages.com/jamaica.

Application

The visa application must be made to the nearest Consulate (or consular section at the Jamaican Embassy or High Commission). It is recommended that students apply at least one month in advance of their intended travel date.

Processing time

Students applying for visas in advance from the embassy/high commission should allow three to five days for processing. If the application has to be referred to Jamaica for approval, it may take two to three weeks.

Sufficient funds

Visa applicants must be able to show proof of sufficient funds to cover their stay in Jamaica.

Cancellation/Refund Policy - International Students

Students must familiarize themselves with UCC's refund policy prior to submitting payment for their studies. Refunds are processed where:

- 1. A program/course is cancelled by the University after a student has paid <u>tuition</u> fees;
- 2. A student completely withdraws from his program of study under the conditions stated below.

Program/Course Cancellation

The UCC reserves the right to withdraw a scheduled course if the registration is insufficient to meet the minimum class size requirements. In such instances, all monies will be refunded (except the non-refundable application fee) less any relevant bank charges (where such bank charges have been deducted during a transfer of funds).

Student Withdrawal

A participant may cancel his enrolment contract, provided UCC is notified no less than **30 days** prior to commencement of the course. In such cases, UCC will retain the application/registration fee only and an **administration fee** of US\$250.

The International students who:

- a. Withdraw *after* instructions have begun, *irrespective of attendance*, within the first two weeks of the term (the Add/Drop period), will receive a 50% of tuition fees paid. The balance of the tuition fee and general fees (including medical insurance fees) will be forfeited.
- 1. Withdraw after the second week of instruction but within the first four (4) weeks, will receive 25% of the total tuition fees paid. The balance of the tuition and general fees will be forfeited.
- 2. Withdraw after the fourth week of instruction, will receive no refund of tuition.
- 3. Fail to notify the International Office that they will not be participating in the program after the start date, will forfeit all fees paid.
- 4. Withdraw due to a failure to obtain a student permit prior to arrival at UCC, the student will be entitled to a full refund of tuition and general fees invoiced less a US\$250 administration fee. Such students must notify UCC in writing and provide documentation prior to the start of the semester stating the Jamaican Embassy's reason the visa was

denied. Total non-refundable amount includes application fee of US\$100 and the administration fee of U\$250 = U\$\$350.

NOTE: Students applying for a Leave of Absence or Deferral are not eligible for refunds. Any monies paid for tuition will be held and applied to the student's account on return. Students who, after starting a program, must return home due to illness or other personal reasons must consult with the International Office to discuss options and possible refunds.

All applications for refunds are to be submitted in writing using the official **Request for Refund Form** available from the International Office. The form must be accompanied by copies of the receipts for payments made. UCC reserves the right to cancel the enrolment of any student if, in our opinion, the student's behaviour is deemed unacceptable. No refund will be made in these circumstances.
