

Courts Jamaica - Scholarships 2018 - Frequently Asked Questions

COURTS JAMAICA: FRIDAY, JUNE 15, 2018

- 1. Q. Who is eligible to apply for the scholarship?
- 1. Courts customer with an account at Courts or Courts Optical who have shopped between 2013 and 2018.
- 2. Q. What are the scholarships being offered?
- 1. Twenty-eight (28) GSAT students will receive \$100,000 each one per branch; ten (10) Tertiary students; four (4) will each receive a full scholarship of \$400,000 each year and Six (6) will each receive a \$250,000 grant. Ten (10) persons will each receive \$50,000 to pursue a skills training program at any HEART Trust/NTA institution.
- 3. Q. If I am under 18 years' old who should apply on my behalf?
- 1. A parent or guardian should apply for a minor.
- 4. Q. If I am over 18 years old but I am not a Courts customer, can my parent or guardian who is a Courts customer apply on my behalf?
- 1. Yes
- 5. Q. Where can I get the application forms?

- 6. Q. When is the scholarship deadline?
 - a. July 6, 2018
 - 7. Q. What if I do not have all the required documents to meet the deadline?
 - a. Unfortunately all scholarship applications must be accompanied by the following documents; any application that is incomplete will not be assessed.

Scholarship Categories

Documents

GSAT

- 1. COPY of GSAT results. Do NOT send original results.
- 2. Letter attached explaining financial need and monthly financial expenses e.g. rent, food, travelling, utilities, medical
- 3. Two recommendation letters to be prepared by a Justice of the Peace (JP), Minister of Religion, Superintendent of Police, Employer, Principal or Teacher of student applying for scholarship

Tertiary

- i. Status letter and copy of last progress report Enrolled students
- ii. Acceptance letter from University or College New students
- iii. Letter explaining financial need and monthly financial expenses e.g. rent, food, travelling, utilities, medical; also provide statement of career ambitions This statement should be type-written on a separate sheet of paper in no more than 300 words.

iv. Two recommendation forms to be completed by a Justice of the Peace (JP), Minister of Religion, Superintendent of Police, Employer, Principal or Teacher of student applying for scholarship

Skills Training

- i. COPY of educational qualifications
- ii. Letter attached explaining financial need and monthly financial expenses e.g. rent, food, travelling, utilities, medical
- iii. Two recommendation forms to be completed by a Justice of the Peace (JP), Minister of Religion, Superintendent of Police, Employer, Principal or Teacher of student applying for scholarship
- 1. Q. Where should I drop off the completed application form?
- Completed application forms can be dropped off at any Courts, Courts Ready Cash and Courts Optical store island-wide.
- 2. Q. Can immediate family members (i.e. mother, father, sister, brother, children) of staff apply?
- 1. No
- 3. Q. If I owe on my account can I apply?
- 1. You can apply if there is a balance on your account; however you are not eligible if your account is in arrears or the account has been cancelled
- 4. Q. Will I be contacted if I am not shortlisted for an interview?
 - A. Unfortunately, based on the volume of applications, persons who are not shortlisted for an interview will not be contacted.
- 1. Q. When can persons expect a call if they are shortlisted?
 - A. Shortlisted applicants will be contacted by the end of July

- 1. Q. When will the scholarships be awarded?
 - A. Scholarships will be awarded to successful recipients in August.
- 1. Q. Can I apply for the tertiary scholarships if I already have a first degree?
 - A. Tertiary scholarships are open only to persons pursuing a first degree.
